Meeting a Need

La Posada Providencia opened on Dec. 1, 1989, by the Sisters of Divine Providence to provide temporary, emergency shelter for poor immigrants, asylees and asylum seekers in the lower Rio Grande Valley of Texas. La Posada works to provide clients with safety, hope, and a way forward by addressing major service gaps for new immigrants.

These service gaps are a lack of emergency housing; inadequate options for employment preparation; lack of accessible English classes; life-skills education; inadequate local public transportation; and lack of access to social services and healthcare until legal status is resolved.

La Posada is the only shelter in the lower Rio Grande Valley that offers individual case management to optimize client resettlement outcomes and that can accommodate extended stays for clients when needed. There are no other homeless shelters in San Benito, and services provided by other Cameron County homeless shelters are focused on serving the general homeless population.



Our Clients

We provide food, shelter and support to hundreds of individuals and families each year, all of whom are in the process of obtaining asylum or other lawful residence in the United States.

We serve single men and women, families and mothers and fathers with children. They are persons who have fled their homelands due to political or religious oppression, natural disaster, or other life-threatening circumstances. Many have endured severe hardships, including poverty, unjust imprisonment, and even torture. Most clients arrive traumatized and destitute with no income.

Clients are referred to us by immigration attorneys, churches and United States immigration officials. We have aided thousands of immigrants and asylum seekers from more than 90 countries since our founding in 1989.

We have sheltered as few as 229 to more than 1,000 clients in one year. Our yearly census responds to turmoil occurring around the world and to changes in United States immigration policies.

Our Staff and Volunteers

La Posada Providencia operates with a dedicated staff. The demands of a 24/7 shelter far exceed the capacity of staff to adequately address all needs at all times. Volunteers make a significant contribution to the work of La Posada by supporting programs and operations. Volunteers help keep operating expenses from rising without sacrificing services to clients.

We are fortunate to host many talented and committed volunteers: short-term, live-in volunteers; Associates of the Sisters of Divine Providence; volunteers from other religious communities, churches and organizations; student volunteers from law schools and universities from around the country; and Winter Texans and local volunteers from the Lower Rio Grande Valley.

Our Programs Include ...

- Shelter, food and clothing: 24-hours a day, 365 days a year
- Case management: needs assessment, goal-setting, and coordination of services to meet those goals
- Local transportation: access to health, legal and social services offices, bus station, etc.
- Language instruction: instructor led or CD/video, plus individual and group conversation practice
- Cultural integration: assistance with shopping, travel and communications, filling out paperwork, and coordination with various agencies, and businesses
- Life skills: computer literacy, financial basics, health and nutrition; and employment readiness
- Self-sustainability practices: organic gardening, recycling, and energy-efficiency
